The Karimjee Jivanjee Foundation is offering two Karimjee Conservation Scholarships to Tanzanian nationals for the MSc Conservation Management of African Ecosystems Programme starting in September 2021.

Scholarships are available to support Tanzanian nationals to study for a two-year MSc programme in the Conservation Management of African Ecosystems.

In the first year of the programme, students will enrol for the MSc in the Conservation Management of African Ecosystems at the University of Glasgow, U.K. (September 2021), and on successful completion of this course, would graduate with a MSc (September 2022). The second year involves a year of supervised field research in Tanzania, developing and implementing a conservation-related project in Tanzania with partners. This provides students with opportunities and support to apply skills for more in-depth field research, to strengthen collaborative links with partner institutions in Tanzania and produce scientific outputs for dissemination, including publications and conference presentations.

In 2021, the Karimjee Jivanjee Foundation is offering two Karimjee Conservation Scholarships for Tanzanian nationals. The scholarship covers all fees and a living allowance (stipend) for studies while in Glasgow and for the additional year in Tanzania, including funds for an extended research project.

Tanzanian students who wish to be considered for this scholarship should apply to the programme in the normal way and include in their personal statement an explanation as to why they think they should be awarded the scholarship. Please note that the closing date for consideration for the Scholarship is 1 April 2021 and short-listed candidates will be expected to attend an on-line video interview in mid-May 2021. Interviews will be conducted in English.

Candidates' attention is drawn to the English requirements (see weblink above) and may wish to acquire proof of language proficiency prior to interview. Candidates who are provisionally offered a scholarship without such proof of language proficiency will need to acquire it immediately following the interviews, before acceptance on the programme can be confirmed.
